"A chair or a table doesn't exist in a vacuum unconnected to a person or a place." San Francisco designer Ted Boerner's furniture is created out of a specific need and follows a purpose. Boerner designs in sketch form first, with the place or the person in mind. "The idea doesn't usually first appear in my head but on paper as I push my pencil, until the design emerges. After finding life in the lines I start to search for the materials which will enhance the form. I'll use whatever fits the scenerio."
